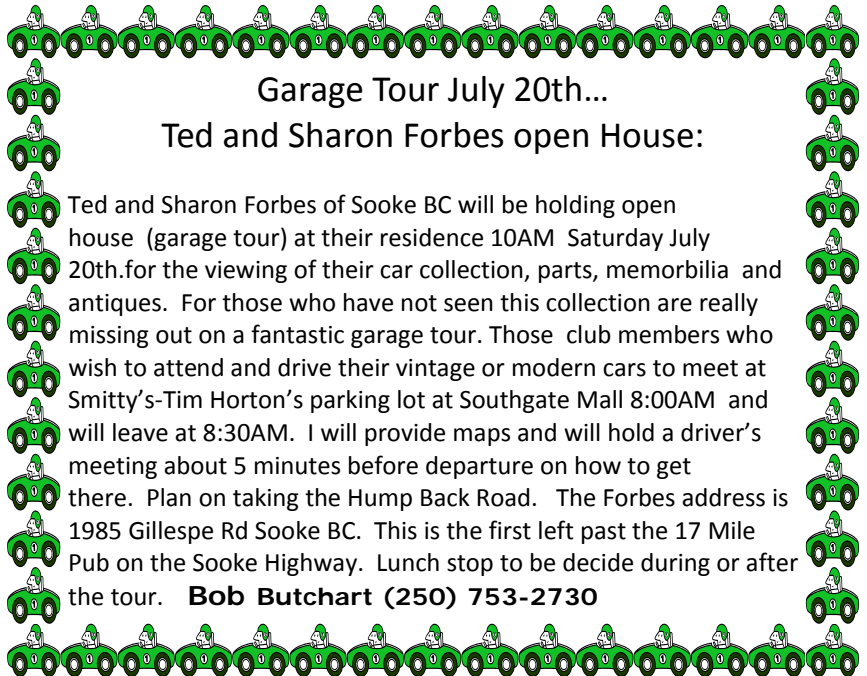

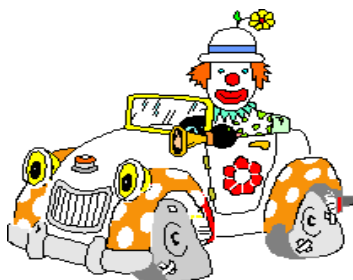


Garage Tour July 20th...

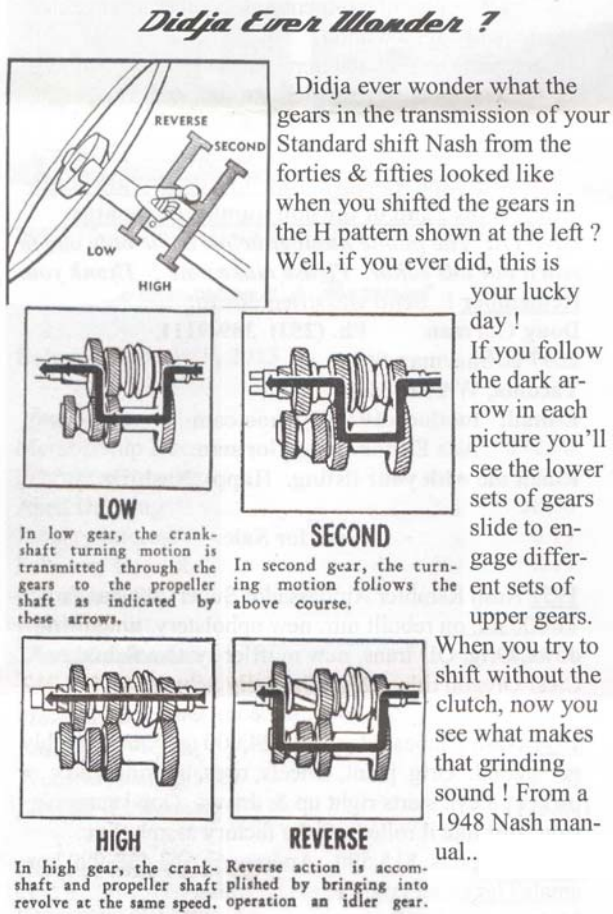
